Merton Parish Council

Minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on Thursday 19th June at 8pm in the Clinton Hall. Apologies: Cllrs Sharpe, Down, Laughton and Collins. Present: Cllrs Horner (chair) Nancekivell, Scantlebury and Phillips. The minutes were signed as a true record having been previously circulated.

Matters Arising: Update of the Square, Mr Mansfield has met with members of the Parish Council on site. It was suggested that the old tarmac in the entrance to the square should be dug out and new tarmac laid and graded back to the hard surface and feathered into the gutter at the side. The gutters will be cleaned out and repaired where necessary. The existing surface will be rolled with a large mechanical roller. The cobbles will eventually be lifted cleaned and re-laid when more funds are available. Upon receipt of the quote it is hoped some of this work can begin. It was agreed by Councillors present that the work can go ahead without another meeting providing a reasonable quote is received. A Parishioner has asked that the drain at the bottom of the square is inspected when this work takes place.

<u>Tarka Trail</u> – A letter has been received from the Clinton Devon Estates in reply to the Councils request for a footpath from the village to connect up to the Tarka Trail. A positive response was received and Clinton Devon Estates are looking into possible sites. This item will be included on the next agenda for further reports. There were no parishioners present so there was no public speaking time.

<u>Post Office</u> - It was reported that the village Post Office is safe at the moment. This is very welcome news.

<u>Recycling Shed</u> - The recycling shed was being taken away by Torridge District Council who felt there was no need for it any longer and suggested that it had been used recently by businesses for their recycling rather than ordinary householders. Cllr Horner managed to secure the shed for storage for the Clinton Hall. <u>Please note it is no longer a recycling shed so nothing should be left outside</u>.

<u>Loan for Clinton Hall</u> - The hall committee no longer needed the short term loan whilst waiting for the grant money as they had managed to obtain a short term loan elsewhere. It was discussed how the councillors would be able to discuss such issues in a normal council meeting as they are Trustees of the hall and therefore would have a prejudicial interest. Legal advice will be sought from Torridge District Council and a dispensation obtained if appropriate.

Cllr Scantlebury has enquired about the cost of setting up a website for the Village. The clerk was asked to contact the CCD to get advice on how other Parish Councils have set up websites and funding available. This will be included on the agenda for the next meeting. It is important that the village and its facilities are promoted.

<u>Parish Plan</u> – The clerk reported that the Parish Plan has now been printed and will hopefully be distributed soon. The steering group will meet to organise this.

<u>Road repairs</u> - A reply had been received following the complaints made to the Devon Highways concerning the road to Tythecombe Lake and the gate entrances on the main road following the recent resurfacing. The gateways will be addressed and the by-road is now due for repairs.

Rural Housing Seminar – Cllr Horner reported on the recent Housing Seminar which was attended by Princess Anne. It appears there is money available for affordable housing but Cllr Horner was uncertain whether it would apply to the needs of Merton because the proposal of six houses may be too small. This would be investigated further. AOB. The footpath from the village to Lower Lodge is again overgrown and complaints have been received. The clerk was asked to contact Torridge District Council. It was also requested that the verge at the top of the village by the planter should be cut when the verges in the village are cut. At present this area is cut by a parishioner on a voluntary basis. A complaint was also made that the tree on the left hand side verge on the exit from Trefusis Terrace is obscuring the vision of the main road. This will be investigated.

It was suggested approaching County Councillor Rawlinson for funding towards the repairs of the village square from his DCC funds. The clerk will send a letter.

Cheques were signed for Internal Auditor, Printing of the Parish Plans, and Devon County Council for administration for the Parish Plans.

The clerk was asked to get forms from the bank for the new councillors to become signatures.

It was agreed to organise the **Bell Fund AGM for Thursday 24th July** at 7.30pm in the Clinton Hall. Everyone is encouraged to come along.

The next Parish Council meeting will be **Thursday 9th September** 2008 at 8pm

There being no further business to discuss Cllr Horner thanked everyone for attending and the meeting closed at $9.15 \mathrm{pm}$
